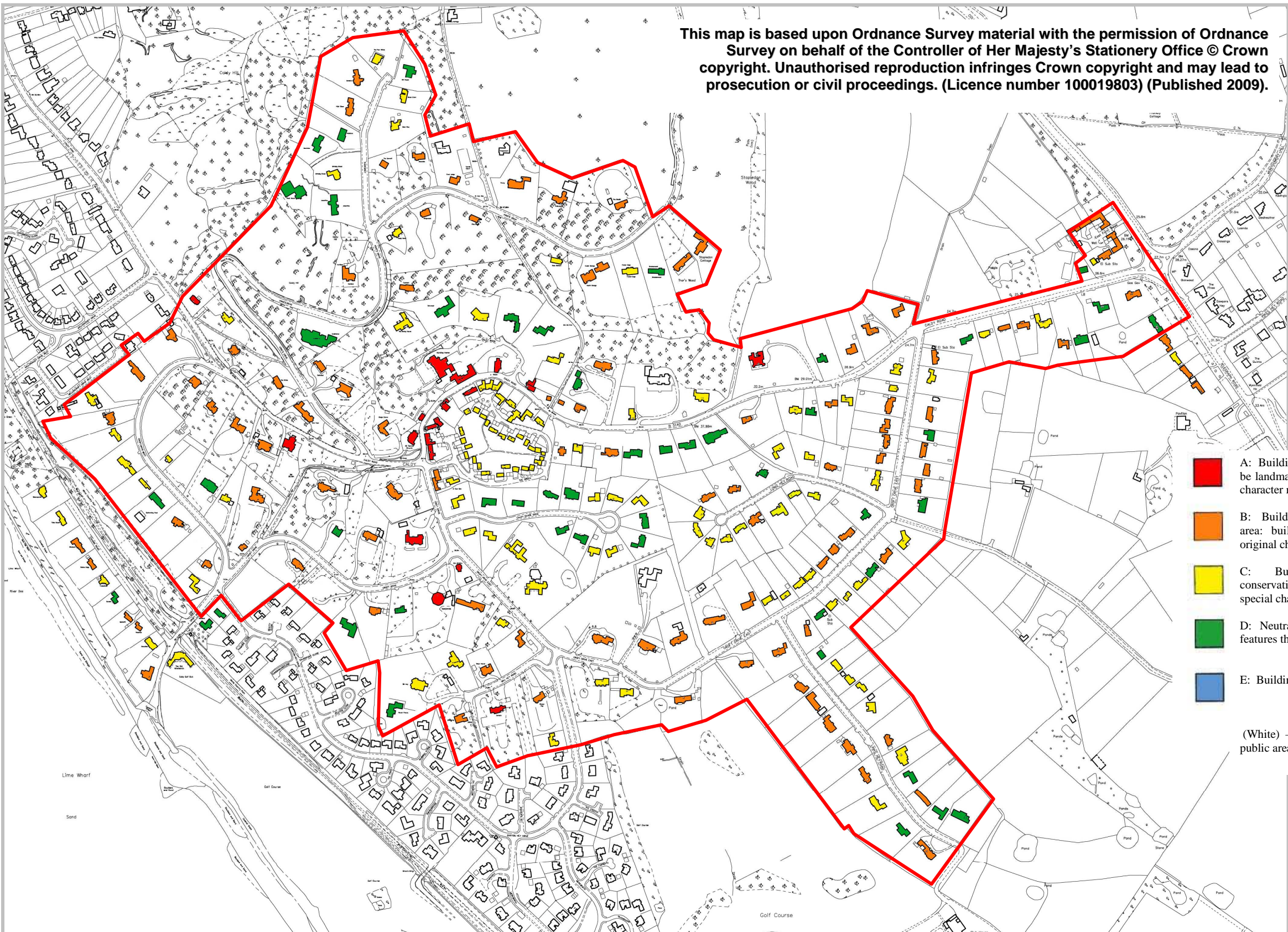

- A: Buildings that are critical to the character of the area: typically these may be landmark buildings and / or historic buildings with most of their original character retained
- B: Buildings that contribute strongly to the character of the conservation area: buildings are generally pre-WWII and may have some alterations but original character is still prominent
- C: Buildings that make some contribution to the character of the conservation area: buildings may be modern with some of the features of the special character of the conservation area or older with significant alteration
- D: Neutral - Modern buildings of little architectural interest largely without features that typify the special character of the conservation area.
- E: Buildings that detract from the significance or character of the area.
- (White) – Buildings not assessed – may not be sufficiently visible from public areas to judge architectural character or historical significance
